

Windsor Minor Hockey Association Police Information Check Instructions

This information is for residents of Windsor only

All WMHA Volunteers must submit to a Police Information Check

Please follow these steps:

 Print and complete the Police Information Check and Request for Police Vulnerable Sector Check forms available on the WMHA website;

THE POLICE 'VULNERABLE SECTOR REQUEST FORM' MUST BE SIGNED BY THE EXECUTIVE V.P BEFORE SUBMITTING TO WINDSOR POLICE DEPARTMENT

- 2. **Bring all (3) completed forms** to Information Services located in the lobby of Windsor Police Headquarters located at 150 Goyeau Street. Counter Service hours 8:00am-4:00pm, Mon through Fri.;
- 3. You will need to produce (2) pieces of valid government issued identification, (1) showing current Windsor address. The fee is \$25.00 cash;
- 4. The Police Service will issue you documents concerning your Police Information Check. You must submit to your WMHA representative receipts and documents pertaining to;

 (a) Date of Submission to Police Headquarters(on receipt) (b) Date Information Check will be ready(on document);
- 5. The Police Information Check will be mailed out to your Windsor address.
- 6. As per RCMP CPIC policy you may be contacted for verification through fingerprint submission. Electronic submission of fingerprints are taken at WPD. Contact 519-255-6700 ext 4129 for an appointment. The fee is \$45.00. Bring (2) pieces of valid government issued identification.
- 7. If fingerprint submission is required inform your WMHA representative. Submit receipt of fingerprint submission once completed to WMHA representative;
- 8. Once a response to your fingerprint submission has been received from the RCMP, your Criminal Record Check will be completed. The completed Record Check will be mailed to your home;
- 9. You <u>must</u> submit your original Record Check . Mail or deliver to: W.M.H.A. Volunteer Information 2643 Askin Ave, Windsor Ont., N9E-3H8. **Record Checks are confidential**;
- 10. The WMHA will reimburse your fees upon receiving your receipts and Record Check. Receipts are to be submitted within 60 days of the date stamped on your Record Check. No refunds will be paid after the 60 day period.

 The Police Information Check will include the following information as it exists on the date of the search: Outstanding entries, such as charges and warrants, judicial orders, Peace Bonds, Probation and Prohibition orders Criminal convictions (summary and indictable) from CPIC and/or local databases. Absolute and conditional discharges. Family court restraining orders. Criminal charges resulting in dispositions including, but not limited to, Withdrawn, Dismissed, and cases of Not Criminally Responsible by Reason of Mental Disorder as listed on local indices. Police contacts including but not limited to theft, weapons, sex offences, or violent, harmful and threatening behaviour. The Police Vulnerable Sector Check will include all of the above and the following information as it exists on the date of the search: Police contacts including but not limited to theft, weapons, sex offences, or violent, harmful or threatening behavior which may or may not have involved a mental health incident where no charges were laid. All pardoned criminal convictions, including sex offences, identified as a result of a Vulnerable Sector Verification search and authorized for release by the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness.
